## **Cross Country**

Children in Key Stage 2 took part, last week, in two Cross Country competitions in the county. The first, at Milton Country Park, was for small schools and a number of our runners gained top 10 places for their year group. The second was the 17th annual St Neots Relay Cross Country. Teams of four compete over 5km taking it in turns. The competition here is fierce, but our girls finished 97th and boys 54th. Well done everyone!

## **Home Learning**

We know that, as parents, you have far more impact on your children's life chances than we do here in school. It's one of the reasons why home learning remains a central part of education policy and it is monitored through Ofsted inspections.

Over the year we have added spelling and, more recently at KS2, times tables practice and so we want to make sure that the balance of tasks remains manageable. With these extra

tasks added, we now think that it will be sufficient for children to complete one yellow-book task per fortnight rather than two. This is to free up time for reading, spelling and maths practice and also encourage the submission of one good, rather than two rushed, pieces of home learning. We will make this change from this week.

This means that our homework expectations are as follows:

- All children should read at least five times per week. This includes children in Key Stage 2, who should have a guided reading book with set reading, as well as those in the early stages of learning to read.
- All children should be practising their exception words spellings in the blue book regularly. Children from Year 1 upwards will also have

- a rules task to complete each fortnight.
- All children should be practising number bonds (addition and subtraction facts) or times tables regularly. Children in Key Stage 2 can use the studyzone.tv website.
- All children should complete one yellow-book task to a good standard each fortnight.

As ever, our advice would be to support children to complete their yellow book task early in the fortnight so that they understand the benefit of having things complete and being able to put them away. Reading, maths and spelling practice benefit from short regular practice more than they do one long session.
