Break Times

We will continue to use The Butts for break and lunch time play throughout the year and we want the children to enjoy some fresh air each day despite the weather conditions. Please therefore ensure that your child(ren) have suitable footwear in school to change into for break times. Ideally we would like every child to have a pair of wellingtons kept in school as they did when they were in Class 1.

Please ensure that all items of clothing are named with your child's name – yes, I know that sounds obvious but we find a surprising number of 'lost' articles that still have the names of children that have left the school and have been passed onto friends.

A reminder that children will need coats in school when the weather turns chillier – again it's easy to overlook this if your child comes to school by car.

Hair

Please remember that if your child has long hair, they will need to wear it tied back/up in school. Loose hair can be hazardous in PE and in other curriculum areas where it may also interfere with their work. Head lice are also transferred more readily in loose hair.

Changes to going-home arrangements

Should your child's going home arrangements change after your child has arrived at school, please telephone the office to let us know rather than by e-mail. All answerphone messages are picked up regularly throughout the day.
