# **Whole-School Responsibilities**

With this newsletter, children will have brought home a short form to show their interest in one of the whole-school responsibilities available to them at Fowlmere.

For children in Classes 2, 3 and 4 there is an opportunity to be elected school council representative for the class. School Council is a group of pupils who meet with me regularly to consider ways to improve our school for all children. Children in Class 1 will be able to choose their representatives a little later in the year when they have settled in.

New this year is an opportunity for children in Years 4, 5 and 6 to be play leaders at break and lunch time. This is an important role supporting younger children with games and activities at break times. We have organised a training session for play leaders on Tuesday 3rd October and have space for up to 20 children.

Finally, children in Year 6 can be elected **House Captain** for their house for the year ahead.

If your children are interested in any of the roles, please can they return the form by Wednesday 27th September. We will hold elections on Thursday that week. Copies of the form are available on the website.


## **School Rules**


