With such little notice, we were really pleased that there were 50 responses to the ParentView survey of parents between our email going out in the afternoon and the following morning. This is a high level of response, comparatively, and I'd like to thank you for acting so promptly, as the information forms an important part of the inspection process.

Inspections are moderated rigorously by Ofsted to ensure that they are consistent between

schools and so I am unable to share any outcomes with you until the report is published in a few weeks' time.

Once we have a final report we will automatically send you all a copy.
