## Half-term

We are finally at the half-term break though the children have found this week very difficult. Everyone is very tired and I have to remember that the last time children did a whole half-term of school it was January/February – a really long time ago.

I hope that you all get a chance for a bit of a break over the half-term week. I'm guessing that most of you are staying in and around Fowlmere, but if you are planning a getaway, please remember to check the rules around quarantine on your return. In the UK, it is advised that you should not travel to Tier 3 areas.

## Covid Update

Positive cases in South Cambridgeshire had risen sharply for the previous two weeks, although have held steady for the latest week for which we have data. I am also aware that some of these cases refer to students who are living elsewhere in the UK, but are registered here in South Cambs. The rate of infection in South Cambs remains well below the national average.

Nevertheless, we have been reviewing our risk assessment in school to take account of the changes in local case numbers and the re-evaluation of the R number for the East of England and so I need to inform you that, if you need to come to the office to drop anything off, or pick up children for an appointment, you will need to wear a face covering on the school site. This does not apply to waiting on the Butts in the morning or afternoon, just coming onto the school site. Children are not required to wear face coverings at any time.

## Positive Cases

Please can you continue to let us know over half-term if your children are accessing any testing for Covid-19. Although the need for school to speak to close contacts diminishes over the holidays (because children won't have been in school), it is very useful for us to keep a picture of what is going on in our community. So far we have been very lucky!

Thank you for all you have been doing to keep to the rules and keep the school informed. It has been much appreciated by us all.
