Class 3 enjoyed a Roman Day led by a local group History Off the Page.

The children dressed as Roman Slaves and experienced life in in 60 AD when the Romans had been in Britain for only 17 years and unrest was growing. They participated in a variety of activities and craft, including making oil lamps, mosaics, metal work, making ink and using a stick to write with it, clay, spices and herbs used for medicine and wax tablets to write letters. In the afternoon the children rehearsed plays and performed them in the Amphitheatre while eating a snack served to them by servants. Some children joined the Roman army and learned about life as a soldier and marching drills.

They also put their learning into practice in the production of Straw and Order where Toby took the Roman army through their paces in Latin!
