### Class 1 at the Botanic Gardens

### School Catering

At the end of last year, Cambridgeshire Catering, who provide our school meals, informed us that they would cease trading on 31st December 2018.

This, obviously, represents a significant challenge for the school (we serve between 70 and 80 meals each day and this is not a particularly attractive option for another company to take on) but is also a significant opportunity to

secure improvements to school meals provision.

Eight local primary schools have decided to work together to procure a new supplier and we are currently in the middle of a tendering process for a two-year contract to provide meals across all eight schools.

Meals will continue to be prepared in-house and we have capped meal costs at a maximum of £2.30 per day. Our service style (set menu, family service) will continue, but menus will change, and providing appetising, good quality meals is very high up our evaluation criteria.

We anticipate a new supplier to take over the provision from September 2018, but this may be phased over the first half-term across the schools involved.
